Keynote Speaker 2009 – Jessica Yee Taking Charge: Indigenous Youth, Violence and Activism

At 23, winner of the 2009 YWCA Young Women of Distinction Award, Jessica has already spent almost half of her life supporting youth through feminism and aboriginal activism. A multiracial Indigenous woman of Chinese and Mohawk descent, she is the founder and director of the Native Youth Sexual Health Network, the first of its kind for aboriginal youth throughout Canada and the US. She recently completed the filming of “Building a Highway of Hope”, a documentary focusing on the infamous Highway of Tears where more than a hundred British Columbia aboriginal women have disappeared or been murdered.
